MOBILITY TO SPAIN

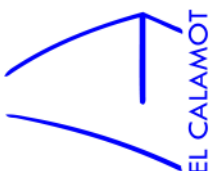
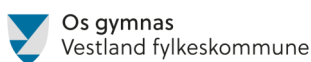
In the context of the Erasmus+ project Students Become Citizens, funded by the European Union, in which the following schools participate:

- Atheneum GO! For Business (Belgium)
- Institut El Calamot (Spain)
- Falkonergårdens Gymnasium og HF (Denmark)
- Liceo delle Scienze Umane Vittorino da Feltre (Italy)
- Os Gymnas (Norway)

The second mobility of the project has been carried out. This time, the high school Institut El Calamot -located in Gavà, Barcelona- has been in charge of organising a programme on citizenship for the participating students and teachers. The hosting school welcomed 24 students and 9 teachers from Belgium, Norway, Italy and Denmark, who arrived in Barcelona on 16th February 2020 and left on 20th. All the international students were hosted in local students' homes for their whole stay. The planning covered full-day activities during 17th, 18th and 19th February.

The content of the activities was mainly related to:

- social minorities and other disadvantaged groups
- citizenship and social issues
- community projects
- English skills and vocabulary for specific purposes



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OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the activities organized by the Spanish school were:

- to raise awareness on citizenship and other social issues
- to participate in community projects for the common good
- to learn how to deal with social issues and social minorities through the presentation of and participation in good practices
- to learn how to make teenagers' voices louder by involving external or local organizations
- to improve English oral skills

PROGRAMME

The programme was designed to share good practices and empower the participants to become active citizenships committed to their social setting. The activities carried out included:

- presentation of best practices -social support, supported learning, personal growth, attention to diversity, ...-
- choosing a logo for the project -selection of logos, created by each school's students, done beforehand-
- volunteering to help the Red-Cross workers during lunchtime
- eTwinning training -teachers- and creation of diary -students-
- joint activity with students who have an intellectual disability
- visiting a youth resources centre and learning new approaches to counselling and empowering teenagers
- talk on inclusion by experts -activity attended by the town's mayor and recorded by local and external press-
- workshops with Roma students, among others
